Dennis Picard Presents “Traditional New England Cider Making, History and Techniques”

Dennis Picard will present his slide show “A Drink When We Want It ... Traditional New England Cider Making, History and Techniques” on Tuesday, November 24th at 7:00 p.m. This free program will be held in the library’s Community Room.

Picard will discuss cider production and use in the region from the 1700s to the mid-1800s. Cider was drunk daily in New England more than 200 years ago. Cider wasn’t the sweet apple cider we drink today but was actually fermented and known as “hard cider”. Learn why this drink was so popular and how it was made.

This program is open to the public and no registration is required. Dennis’ program is funded by the *Friends of the Southwick Public Library*.
